NEIGHBORHOOD RAPID DISASTER ASSESSMENT KIT

START UP AND MAINTENANCE INSTRUCTIONS

START UP

- 1. Once the Neighborhood Rapid Disaster Assessment Kit (NRDAK) has been assembled for your neighborhood, you should:
 - a. Define an assembly location (the NRDAK should be securely housed at that location) a second copy may be secured elsewhere in case that location suffers damage);
 - b. Insure that individuals who have access to the building are assigned to report to the location to facilitate access for those coming to assist;
- 2. You should conduct training on the system with those living in your neighborhood. Your instruction should include the following:
 - i. Instruction on basic personal and family preparedness;
 - ii. The importance of evaluating personal property and taking care of their immediate family needs prior to coming to the assembly location;
 - iii. The identification of the assembly location;
 - iv. Information to help them avoid hazards when responding and assisting with assessments, including proper clothing for response;
 - v. A basic overview of how the assessment plan works;
 - vi. The importance of working together and working within the system to insure personal safety and incident coordination.

MAINTENANCE

- At least yearly, meet and review the NRDAK for needed updates. Add new residences and update family names if they are included on your Team/Location forms. Redefine neighborhood boundaries if necessary to insure growth has not increased neighborhood density to unacceptable levels.
- 2. Provide a review of the initial training to neighborhood members to insure they remain familiar with the system and how it is implemented.
- 3. If desired an exercise can be done using a portion, or all, of the neighborhood in a simulated disaster to increase neighborhood awareness and insure those participating understand the system.
